Dr. Michael Sauri is a specialist in Occupational Medicine and Infectious Diseases in private practice in Rockville, Maryland since 1987. He is the Medical Director of Occupational Health Consultants (www.ohcmd.com) that services a variety of local and international companies, federal contractors, and over 130 biomedical research laboratories in the Washington metropolitan area. Dr. Sauri is an infectious diseases consultant for SAIC at Ft. Detrick, the CMA (Competent Medical Authority) for Midwest Research in the Personnel Reliability Program, and the workman's compensation and occupational medicine physician for the majority of the research subcontractors working at NIH and at the Henry Jackson Foundation. He is a certified Medical Review Officer. He serves as a Tropical Medicine consultant to several international corporations and to travelers visiting his Travel Advisory and Immunization Clinic (www.travelclinicmd.com).

Dr. Sauri received his Medical Degree from Loyola University, Stritch School of Medicine (Chicago) and a Masters in Public Health/Tropical Medicine and Hygiene from Tulane University. During his twelve years in the Military, Dr. Sauri received Residency training in General Preventive Medicine in the US Air Force (USAF School of Aerospace Medicine) and General Internal Medicine in the US Army (Brooke Army Medical Center) and Infectious Diseases Fellowship training in the US Navy (Bethesda Navy Hospital). In addition, he received his third Board certification in Occupational Medicine in 1994, was certified in Tropical Medicine in 1997 and became board eligible for Medical Toxicology in 2000. Dr. Sauri is licensed to practice Medicine in Maryland, Virginia, DC, Texas and Mississippi. Dr. Sauri currently on the Medical Staff of Shady Grove Adventist Hospital, Suburban Hospital and Howard University Hospital and a Fellow of the American College of Physicians, American College of Preventive Medicine, American College of Occupational and Environmental Medicine, Royal Society of Tropical Medicine and Hygiene and Certificated in Clinical Tropical Medicine and Traveler's Health by the American Society of Tropical Medicine and Hygiene.

As an educator in the Military, Dr. Sauri was the Supervisor of the Global Medicine Course at the USAF School Of Aerospace Medicine Education Division at Brooks AFB, Texas. He was also Director of the USAF General Preventive Medicine Residency and responsible for the General Preventive Medicine Residency training of two 3rd Year and two 2nd Year Residents. In the US Army, as the Chief of the Department of Medicine at a US Army MEDDAC, Dr. Sauri served as the Training Supervisor For Uniformed Services University School Of Health Sciences' (USUHS) 4th Year Medical Students' hospital rotations. As a private practitioner, Dr. Sauri supervised an AIDS research project for a USUHS fellow and published a review of the clinic's 10 years of smallpox vaccination experience following the terrorist attack on 9-11. In addition, Dr. Sauri has served as a FAA-certified Aeromedical Examiner, a clinical instructor at Howard University in the

area of AIDS and Wasting Syndrome and has served as a member in several research and hospital Institutional Review Boards.

Dr. Sauri's military service included two years reserve duty in Medical School as an HPSP scholarship recipient during the Vietnam War, followed by six years (6-23-75 to 6-6-81) in the U.S. Air Force Medical Corps with an honorable discharge as a Medical Officer and Flight Surgeon at the rank of Major; Dr. Sauri then transferred to the U.S. Army Medical Corps for another six years: (7-1-81 to 8-28-87) and was honorably discharged as a Medical Officer and Flight Surgeon at the rank of Lt. Col. During his period of active service, he authored numerous articles in the area of Chemical/Biological Warfare, Medical Care of Refugee/Displaced Populations, Tropical Diseases, and AIDS.

Dr. Sauri is the recipient of numerous awards and decorations from the Department of Defense, State Department, as well as State and Local governments, including the Military Humanitarian Service Medal and the State of Maryland's Governor's Citation and the Maryland Board of Physician's Certificate of Appreciation in 2005 for his volunteer medical relief work for Hurricane Katrina victims in Jefferson Parish, Louisiana. Dr. Sauri has the distinction of being the first military physician to have been awarded the Defense Superior Service Medal (the highest peacetime military service medal).

Dr. Sauri has been selected seven times (consecutively) by his peers in the Physician Poll in the Washington Metropolitan Area (Washingtonian Magazine) as one of the Top Physicians in Infectious Diseases (Nov 1991, Nov 1993, Nov 1995, Mar 1999, Nov 2002, Jul 2005, and Apr 2008). He was also named as one of the Top Physicians in Internal Medicine in the same magazine (Nov 2002 and Jul 2005).
